## APPENDIX.

EXTRACT of a LETTER from Mr THOMAS RANDOLPHE to the EARL of BEDFORDE, dated Edenburgh, 7th April 1565.\*

From the Paper-Office, London.

For certayne ther is founde a Cave bysyds Muskelbourge, stondinge upon a number of Pillers, made of tyle stones curieuslye wroughte, signefyinge great antiquetie, and straynge monuments found in the same. Thys comyethe to my knowledge, bysyds the comon reporte by th' assurance of Alexander Clerke, whoe was ther to see yt, w<sup>ch</sup> I wyll do myself w<sup>th</sup>in these three or four dayes, and wryte unto yo<sup>r</sup> Ldshp the more certayntie thereof, for I wyll leave nothynge of it unseen.
