9. Stone Coffins found near Stockbridge.—Extract from the Minutes of the Society, dated April 28. 1823.

Several rude stone coffins were lately found about a quarter of a mile to the west of Stockbridge. They were discovered in digging the foundation of a house on the north side of Saxe Cobourg Place, near the new chapel now erecting for St Cuthbert's parish. Two urns of baked clay found in one of the coffins were presented to the Society by Joseph Gordon, Esq. W. S. In the same coffin were contained several unburnt human bones; these were observed to be strewed around the urns.*
