REPORT ON THE PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE SCULPTURED STONES EARLIER THAN A.D. 1100 IN THE DISTRICT OF SCOTLAND NORTH of the RIVER DEE; obtained under the Jubilee Gift of His Excellency Dr R. H. Gunning, F.S.A. Scot. By J. Romilly allen, F.S.A. Scot.

In accordance with instructions received from the Council of the Society, I have been engaged during the past year (1893) in getting together a fairly representative series of photographs of the sculptured stones of Scotland with symbols and Celtic ornament, earlier than A.D. 1100. I confined my attention last year exclusively to the monuments in the northern half of Scotland, and I hope to complete the series for the southern half of Scotland before the end of the present year (1894).

The photographs are being procured chiefly with the object of reproducing them as illustrations for the forthcoming work on the Early Christian Monuments of Scotland, to be issued by the Society. For this purpose only the best examples were selected from a large number of monuments. I trust, however, that the work will not stop here, and that the Society will be impressed with the desirability of carrying out a systematic photographic survey, not only of the sculptured stones, but of the antiquities of Scotland generally.

Before ordering photographs to be taken specially of any monument, I have always endeavoured to ascertain whether it had already been photographed either by an amateur or a professional. The result of inquiries made in the localities where the monuments are situated, and at photographers' establishments throughout Scotland, has been to show that a very small percentage of the stones have been taken; generally in cases where they were near a large town, or in some much-frequented tourist resort. I have often asked photographers why they neglected antiquities, and the reply has always been that work of that kind was quite unremunerative, so that the only time they ever turned their attention to such things was when they had a spare plate or two left over after taking general views of some great landowner's house and grounds. Even when I have been able to obtain photographs of sculptured stones, I have found them of but little use for archæological purposes, either because they were too small or not distinct enough to show the details clearly, or because the view was a perspective one, showing two faces, instead of showing every face in elevation, by placing the camera right in front of each.

The following is a list of the monuments of which I have been able to purchase photographic prints, or of which I have been given prints by amateurs :-




A small proportion of these are quite suitable for reproduction as illustrations of the proposed work on the Early Christian Monuments, and I would suggest that permission should be obtained to use those marked with an asterisk.

As so few photographs were already available, it was obviously necessary to have the greater part of the stones, more particularly those in remote districts, taken specially. In order to do this two courses were open-(1) to secure the services of a competent photographer and get him to take the whole of the stones, in which case it would be necessary to pay his travelling and hotel expenses in addition to the cost of procuring the negatives ; or (2) to employ the best local photographer in each district. Whichever alternative was adopted, the photographer would require to have a knowledge of the stones before-hand, or to receive directions from someone who was thoroughly acquainted with the positions, surroundings, size, and condition of the monuments, so as to be able to say whether preparations would have to be made previously by cleaning the surfaces of the monuments, by removing the earth accumulated round the base, or by any other precaution to secure a satisfactory result. If it had been possible to find someone who combined a knowledge of archæology with the skill of an accomplished photographer, and also was a man of resource in devising special expedients to meet each difficulty, he might have been entrusted to carry out the whole of the work. Unfortunately, howbver, such a person was not forthcoming, and as it would have doubled the travelling expenses to send a professional photographer round to all the stomes under the personal supervision
of an archæologist, it was decided to employ a local photographer in each district and to give him the necessary instructions by letter. I accordingly ascertained the names of the best-known local photographers, and got them to give estimates for taking negatives of certain stones in their own immediate neighbourhoods.

The photographs of the stones in the counties of Caithness and Sutherland, in the Northern Section, were taken by Mr Dixon, the Postmaster at Golspie, under the superintendence of the Rev. J. M. Joass, LL.D., and have been generously presented to the Society by him. They are as follows :-

All the negatives are whole plates, $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$, with the exception of the back and front of the Kintore Stone, which are half plates, $6 \frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{1}{4}$. The scale is in most cases about $\frac{1}{12}$ real size.

The experience gained in having these photographs taken shows that entirely satisfactory results can only be obtained-(1) when the light
is sufficiently bright; and shining at an oblique angle to the surface of the slab; and (2) when the surface is of uniform colour. By comparing the distinctness of the surroundings and background with the sharpness of the details of the sculpture on the monuments, it is possible to determine whether the defects in the picture of the monument arise from bad photography or from the unfavourable nature of the surface of the monument, or the direction and intensity of the light. It will be found that the success of the photographer depends much less on his technical skill than on the circumstances being favourable in the respects specified above.

I have therefore arrived at the following conclusions :-
(1) That the photographs of stones in museums come out better than those in the open air, partly because the stones are less discoloured by lichen, moss, \&c., and partly because the light is more diffused.
(2) That the best result of all would be obtained by photographing a perfectly white cast in a studio, where it could be shifted about until the light fell exactly at the right angle, and where the amount of light could be regulated.
(3) That large patches of white lichen or black moss, as on the upright cross-slabs at Farr and at Shandwick, are absolutely fatal to a good result.
(4) That with regard to the colour of the surface of the stone, when free from lichen, \&c., yellowish or whitish sandstone is the best (as, for instance, the Collieburn Stone at Dunrobin), next to this blueish or greenish whinstone (like the Keith Hall Stone), and worst of all red sandstone (like the Rosemarkie Stone) or red granite (like the Maiden Stone).
(5) That with regard to the texture of the surface, the more even it is the better, granite being especially difficult to photograph on account of the large shining crystals, which scatter the light and obscure the sculpture.

In conclusion, it may be worth while to say a few words about the different uses to which the photographs of the monuments can be put.

In the first place, photographs are exceedingly useful for purposes of study, because they give a more accurate representation of the monu-
ments than it is possible to get in any other way, and when a monument has been destroyed a photograph of it becomes almost invaluable. I would therefore urge upon the Society the desirability of forming a complete collection of photographs of Scottish antiquities. Amateurs and others would no doubt give valuable assistance in this direction if they received some encouragement and advice from the Society.

Next, with regard to utilising the photographs of the monuments for purposes of illustration by direct reproduction or otherwise.

The object of illustrating the monuments is twofold-(1) to show their general appearance and surroundings, and (2) to show the details of the sculpture. But in any case where the photograph is to be reproduced direct it is absolutely essential that the negative should be sharp and of the best quality, so that it is only possible to use a limited number of selected specimens for this purpose. In reproducing photographs by the half-tone process, where the grain is given by a network of fine lines crossing at right angles, it is well to remember that the scale of the details should bear a certain proportion to the quality of the grain. The smaller the grain in comparison with the size of the details the better, as the half-tone engravings will not bear magnifying, and become coarser and coarser as they are enlarged. Photographs reproduced by the photogravure, collotype, autotype, and numerous other processes, will bear magnifying, and show much finer details than the half-tone blocks, but they are much more expensive, and have to be printed as plates instead of as blocks amongst the letterpress.

Photographs which are not good enough to be reproduced direct may be enlarged and touched up by hand with Indian ink and Chinese white, so as to bring out the details, and then be again reduced. Another method is to transfer the photograph to a wood block and add the details in pencil before it is engraved. Even when a photograph is not of much use alone, it may help to make a good drawing when a rubbing and measurements of the stone have been taken.

I append a list of the whole of the stones, arranged topographically, so as to show the number and the sizes of their sculptured faces.
