


Fig. 1. Stone battle-axe from Forth, Lanarkshire. Scale \( \frac{1}{3} \). (See Museum Donations 1964-5, Item 9.)




Fig. 2. Pot from Luce Sands, Wigtownshire. Scale  $\frac{1}{3}$ . (See Museum Donations 1964–5, Item 12.)




Fig. 3. Early Iron Age pot from Colonsay. Scale ½. (See Museum Donations 1964-5, Item 21.)




Fig. 4. Flanged axe from Clunas, Nairnshire. Scale ½. (See Museum Donations 1965-6, Item 17.)


