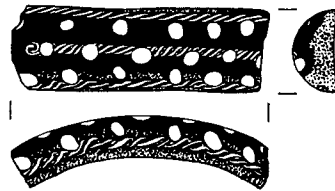


FIG 1 Glass armlet from Fraoch Eilean, Loch Awe, Argyll (scale 1 : 1)
