## 2. COIN HOARD, CASTLE MAOL, SKYE.

While Mrs H. M. Cadell of the Grange, Linlithgow, and her family were picnicing in the end of April 1951 at Castle Maol, Kyleakin, Skye (R.C.A.M., No. 648), they discovered a hoard of coins in a chink of the ruined masonry on the exterior of the western side. It appeared from the way they were stacked as if the coins had been rolled in a stocking or other container, though no actual traces remained of such. Our thanks are due to Mrs Cadell for reporting the find. After cleaning in the Museum the following list could be made-many are
