Capo Long Barrow is situated in a clearing near the southern boundary of Capo Plantation c0.5km north of the River North Esk (*Illus 1*). The barrow was first identified by Dr W Dally of Edzell and the Arbroath Antiquary Club in 1968 (*Piggott 1970; Henshall 1972, 562*). A survey was carried out in September 1970 while the barrow was still under tree cover. A contour plan, one longitudinal and five transverse profiles of the mound were produced. These pencil

drawings are archived in the NMRS and have never been published.

The undergrowth of small trees and shrubs surrounding and covering the long barrow was cleared by the Association of Certificated Field Archaeologists (ACFA), prior to their survey of a parallelogram enclosure that surrounds the barrow, in 1990. Their drawings, however, were never completed (*pers comm S Wood*). They too have been archived in the NMRS.
